SENIOR AGREEMENT

The **Senior Agreement** is a form that is given to all members of the graduating class. It expresses the expectations of the high school for the year as it pertains to seniors. This form must be signed by the student, the student's parents or guardian, and returned to the Assistant Principal's Office. Senior's names on diplomas will read as written on the student Senior Agreement that is on file. If you have not done so already, turn your fully signed copy in the AP office immediately. **Please note: Any senior suspended during the senior year must complete an additional 20 hours of community service to be eligible for the graduation ceremony.**

SENIOR CLASS MEETINGS

SENIOR OBLIGATIONS AND FINES

All obligations and fines accumulated during the **first semester** must be paid by **Monday, March 1st** in order to purchase prom tickets. All obligations and fines accumulated during the **second semester** must be paid by **Friday, April 23** in order to purchase Grad Nite and/or graduation tickets. Obligations and fines include Student Store accounts, and/or library fines.

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

As a condition of graduation, all seniors are required to complete 40 hours of community service. The community service experiences must be documented on a "Form D" verification sheet and submitted in the Counseling Office to be posted in the computer. **Please note: Any senior suspended during the senior year must complete an additional 20 hours of community service to be eligible for the graduation ceremony. Community Service hours are due on Friday, May 14.**

Saturday, May 1
8:00 p.m. – 12:00 a.m.

Prom will be held at the Skirball Cultural Center in Los Angeles, California. Seniors will be allowed to purchase **one** ticket and **one** guest ticket. **Students must have their student identification card to finalize their purchases.** Guest passes are required at the time of purchase. Guest passes are available in the Assistant Principals office. Tickets will be sold in the Student Store during lunchtime, before and after school, beginning **March 15**. Each Prom ticket will cost \$95.00 or \$190.00 for two. Prom tickets will be sold online from March 15 – April 5. Purchase your tickets in payments starting on March 15. **An early bird sale for two tickets will be held on Friday, March 19th for only \$150.00, a \$40.00 savings! This is a one day sale. This purchase MUST be made in the Student Store.**

POLICY AND RULES FOR PROM
READ BEFORE ATTENDING

- Students **may not** enter the dance after 9:00 p.m.
- **Once Prom guests leave the dance,** re-entry to the dance is not permitted. Parents will be called when you leave the dance before 10:30 PM.
- To ensure the safety of all attendees, **light pat downs for male students** and **purse checks for female students** will be done prior to entering the facility.
- **MHS Administration reserves the right to search students, their possessions and vehicles (including Limousines) prior to, and during their attendance at the Prom.**
- Students arriving at school functions, such as the dance, **under or suspected of being under the influence of a controlled substance may not be admitted.** Such students will be isolated immediately. If it is determined that the student is under the influence, custody will be arranged with the local authorities or the individual's parents. A Breathalyzer will be on site. In addition to any legal actions taken by the police, a 5-day suspension will result from students violating this policy.
- **The following items are not allowed at the Prom and will be confiscated:** drugs, alcohol, alcohol flasks, tobacco products, weapons, canes, chains of any kind, lanyards, bandanas, non prescription medication, gum, mints, glow in the dark items, lighters, matches, markers, ink pens, pencils, sharp objects, water bottles, outside food, and liquid items such as mouth wash, eye drops, perfume, body spray, hand-sanitizers, travel size products, glue, liquid eye liner. **These items will not be returned.**
- **To enter the Prom,** MHS students **MUST present their MHS student ID card** along with their **numbered Prom ticket,** which indicates his or her name. If students do not have their tickets, they **will not** be permitted into the dance. **No exceptions! No lists will be available.**
- Guests attending Prom **MUST** have a guest pass on file with the Assistant Principal's office, a photo ID card and numbered Prom ticket. If students do not have these items, they **will not** be permitted into the dance. **No exceptions!**

- **Prom tickets are nontransferable and nonrefundable.** This means the person buying the ticket is the person who attends the dance and brings photo ID. No refunds will be given if a student is directed, or decides to leave before the end of the dance.

Graduation practice is on **Tuesday, June 8 and Wednesday, June 9.** **This is mandatory.**

GRAD NIGHT 2009 at DISNEYLAND

This year MHS Seniors will be going to the happiest place on earth, Disneyland! Students will leave for Grad-Night right after the graduation ceremony. Admission into Disneyland include, charter buses, unlimited use of available attractions (except arcades and shopping), and unlimited use of available entertainment and dancing. Tickets will be sold in the Student Store during lunchtime, before and after school, beginning Monday, April 12. Grad Night tickets will be sold online from April 5- May 3. Tickets are sold on a first serve basis. This event will sell out. Each grad night ticket will cost **\$95.00**. **An early bird sale for one ticket will be held on Friday, April 16th for only \$85.00, a \$10.00 savings. This purchase MUST be made in the student store. This is a one day sale. A payment plan is available starting on April 16th.**

POLICY AND RULES FOR GRAD NIGHT
READ BEFORE ATTENDING

- **The items listed below are NOT ALLOWED at Disneyland. To ensure the safety of all attendees, light pat downs for male students and purse checks for female students will be done prior to loading the buses at MHS. Clothing with MHS logos or team affiliations** (ex. letterman jackets or sports teams), torn jeans and shirts, extremely revealing clothing, see through clothing, bathing suit tops, low v-neck shirts, pants that will not stay up without a belt, no hats, bandanas, duo rags, beanies, skull caps, spiked style jewelry, drugs, alcohol, alcohol flasks, tobacco products, weapons, canes, chains of any kind, lanyards, prescription medication (inhalers okay), non prescription medication, gum, mints, glow in the dark items, lighters, matches, smoking pipes, markers, ink pens, pencils, laser pointers, sharp objects, water bottles, aerosol cans or bottles, backpacks, camera cases, cell phone cases, tote bags, hip packs, oversized purses, outside food, and liquid items such as mouth wash, eye drops, perfume, body spray, hand-sanitizers, travel size products, glue, liquid eye liner.

POLICY AND RULES FOR GRAD NIGHT
READ BEFORE ATTENDING

- **Students under or suspected of being under the influence of a controlled substance will not be allowed in the park. Such students will be isolated immediately by the Disneyland personnel. If it is determined that the student is under the influence, custody will be arranged with the local authorities.** Parents will be notified by the MHS staff to contact the Anaheim Police Department. Disneyland strictly enforces all of the above.
- **Students are allowed to wear jeans, tennis shoes, sandals, and bring cameras and cell phones.**
- To ensure the safety of all attendees, **light pat downs for male students** and **purse checks for female students** will be done prior to boarding the buses at MHS.
- **MHS Administration reserves the right to search students, their possessions and vehicles prior to, during and after Grad Night.**

GRADUATION 2010
Thursday, June 10
6:00 p.m.

Participating in the graduation is a privilege and it signifies the culmination of thirteen years of education. All seniors are eligible to participate in the graduation ceremony if a Senior Agreement is on file in the Assistant Principal's Office, satisfactory attendance is maintained, required credits for graduation are completed, all debts owed to the school are paid, and the student is not involved in any serious behavioral offenses.

Due to the limited amount of space on graduation day, it is required that all attending guests have a ticket to enter the graduation facility. All seniors will receive four (4) complimentary tickets. Students may purchase up to ten (10) additional tickets for their guests. Tickets are \$7.00 each in the Student Store during lunchtime, before and after school beginning **Friday, May 21.**
